Encyclia cochleata is an epiphyte which is found from Florida to Brazil. Known as the cockleshell orchid, the flower has the labellum or lip, which is shaped like a cockleshell, at the top and the petals and sepals hang down, giving the appearance of a squid or other sea creature. This orchid was the first epiphytic orchid to flower in Kew Gardens, London, England in 1787, and at that time it was known as Epidendrum cochleatum. Encyclia cochleata was awarded only this month—the first time it has ever been awarded in Australia—it received an HCC/AOC—the plant was the Grand Champion of our Autumn Show and the owner is Tony DeIonno. Congratulations Tony.

Cattleya aclandiae:

The plants of this species grow in baskets or on cork or tree fern slabs near the glass. Their thick roots, well attached to the bark or basket require an exposed environment. They need plenty of light and warmth, a humid atmosphere and ample moisture during growing periods but dry conditions during resting periods. It is native in the State of Bahia, Brazil, where it grows near the ocean. Plants grow on small trees scattered over arid lands with continuous heat and light but over which humid air blows.
