**SINGAPORE WORLD ORCHID CONFERENCE**  
**13<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> NOVEMBER 2011**

A.O.C. have been able to arrange a very satisfactory set of prices through Flight Centre, Modbury for the WOC to be held in Singapore later this year.

The price (\$2228 pp) includes 7 nights accommodation (executive rooms at the Carlton Hotel, Bras Basah Road, next door to Raffles Hotel – breakfast included) together with return airfares Adelaide-Singapore-Adelaide. Private vehicle transfer is also included to and from the airport in Singapore. The Carlton Hotel also provides late checkout on the final day, with baggage hold until departure to the airport. The above quote was at 12/01/11, but I have been advised that Singapore Airlines have reduced this by a significant amount.

The WOC is being held in the Marina Sands Hotel which is approximately 1km away. There should be ample public transport available, buses and by that time possibly the train service will be extended. I think that there could also be buses organised by the WOC committee for registrants who are accommodated further away than walking distance.

### **About Roger (our guest speaker) and Pauline Rankin**

Pauline bought their first orchid in 1979. Little did she know what she was letting them in for! Since then they have won many Championship Medals at National and Club Shows. They tend not to exhibit very much now, since they are so involved in judging and the administration of the Australian Orchid Council (AOC) Judging System at both Regional and National levels.

A number of their orchids (Paphiopedilums, Cymbidiums and Australian Native Epiphytes) have been granted AOC Awards, including Australian Orchid Hybrid of the Year in 1997. They have grown a wide range of genera, with an emphasis, mainly on Novelty Paphiopedilums and they have a strong interest in species orchids. In the orchid world there are always plenty of challenges waiting for when one thinks one has the game mastered! Their most recent challenge was to drastically reduce their collection when they moved to a house with minimal garden area.

Although they did not train together, they have been qualified AOC Judges for quite a number of years.

Roger was Registrar of Judges at Gawler District Orchid Club for five years in the early 1990s and Registrar of Judges at the Orchid Club of SA from 1995 (this automatically meant he was also State AOC Registrar, then. He has continued as the Registrar of the SA Regional (AOC) Judging Panel since it was formed at the beginning of 1999 and has been Chairman of our Regional Student Judges Training Panel since 1996. Pauline is Assistant Registrar (i.e. the secretary!) of the Regional Panel, and is a member of the Training Panel.

Nationally, Roger has been Deputy Registrar General of Judging of the AOC since 1999. Pauline has had a period as SAROC Delegate to the AOC and she has also been AOC Vice President. They were foundation members of the Gawler Districts Orchid Club Inc., and are Life Members. They are Joint Patrons of Mt. Gambier Orchid Club Inc., Murray Darling Orchid Club Inc. and Riverland Orchid Society Inc.

Some years ago they produced a small book called 'Orchid Wise', containing witty sayings which are often quoted in various club magazines. They were also on the editorial committee that produced the culture book 'Orchid Culture - Some Sound advice'.

More important than all that, is that they are just ordinary people who love growing, talking about, and promoting interest in orchids. They delight in talking to people, and sharing what they know with orchid growers and club members. They are strictly hobby growers.

In addition to what Roger covers in his talk, he is always happy to address any questions from the floor on any orchid culture or judging matter.

After discussion and further investigation it was agreed that the small white marks on the leaves and loss of colour was most likely caused by Red spider mite.

It was suggested that a spray of Maverick diluted with Pestoil would help prevent such damage.

## August Plant Commentary

**Flower of the Night and Flower of Open Division:** Dock. Teretifolia benched by David and Kay Cammack. A relatively small, but sturdy, well grown plant bearing numerous inflorescences with 4 to 7 flowers. The Flowers were 50 – 60 mm across and some 40 mm tall, sepals narrow and white, petals narrower than sepals and also white. The small white labellum curled right under and had fine serrations along the edges and was very finely spotted in red.



**Flower of First Division:** Dock. Teretifolia 'JAGERBE' HCC grown by Denise and Ian Attenborough. A typical example of the 'Bridal veil' orchid. A relatively large plant although has diminished in size since being awarded. This is probably the best flowering since being awarded.



**Flower of second division:** Cym. (Templestowe Dream x Strath Meadows) benched by Steve Hewlett. A small seedling plant with one inflorescence carrying five flowers which were 115 mm across and 110 mm tall. Sepals and petals white with spots forming fine stripes. The petals had five stripes and was paler in between the stripes. The sepals had a single stripe along the mid-line. The labellum was very pale cream to white with heavy deep purple barring around the edge. The column was deep purple with purple striping on the underside and a cream pollen cap. A plant with possibilities for the future.

## WINTER SHOW Plant Commentary

**Grand Champion and Champion of 2nd Division:** *Odontioda Sambrai* benched by Grace Noll. An excellent specimen plant with five well displayed inflorescences, 4 with many flowers and one with fewer. Each of the four larger also had a small branch bearing several flowers each. Sepals and petals very deep maroon, the base of the labellum, a slightly lighter shade of maroon with the mid-lobe of the labellum a pristine white.



**Champion of 1st Division:** *Cymbidium Mini Tan 'Tango'* benched by Rod and Judy McRedmond. A plant with 2 inflorescences carrying 17 and 12 flowers 80 mm across and 75 mm tall. The sepals and petals base colour green overlaid with very fine light brown spotting and striping and darker brown on the reverse side. The labellum was bright yellow with strong deep red striping and the column yellow with some light red markings and a yellow pollen cap.



**Champion of Open Division:** *Cymbidium One Tree Hill 'Solstice Gold'* benched by Denis and Glenys Cook. A well grown small plant carrying a single upright spike with 21 open almost round flowers 60 mm wide x 58 mm tall. Flowers were very filled in. The sepals and petals were very light green and evenly coloured. The labellum was cream at the base and mid-lobe barred deep red with some spotting and the column was pale green with a cream pollen cap.





## WINTER SHOW Plant Commentary (cont.)

The variety of genera and quality of plants made a very good show and members are to be congratulated for their contributions to the show. Some of the other champions included:

Zga. [Beverly x Z (Warrigal Wonder x Kiwi Choice)] benched by George Misirlis. A plant with three inflorescences bearing 4, 5 and 6 flowers with green sepals and petals heavily overlaid with deep brown blotches and a showy labellum with a white base with heavy purple striping.

Paph. Spicerianum shown by Oui Ju and Michael Willoughby. The plant bore four flowers each of their own stems. The dorsal sepal was white with a deep maroon stripe along the mid line and some pink shading on either side. The ventral sepal was pale green and the petals were green with a red-brown line along the mid-vein and some "roughling" of "frilling" along the upper edge. The labellum was green-brown with some linear marking from the edge to the base.

Pros. Cochleata 'Rita' shown by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. There were seven inflorescences with 6 to 7 and one inflorescence still to open. The interesting 'upside down' flowers with their labellums pointing skyward and the sepals and petals hanging down made a good display. The labellum was green to cream with red stripes around the edge at the top and darker solid maroon edges either side near the base. The centre of the labellum was greenish cream with fine maroon markings. The petals were pale green.

Phal. Unknown hybrid benched by Helmut and Ursula Herrmann. This plant had two spikes, one with six open flowers 95 mm across and 80 mm tall while the second spike had two open flowers and buds still to open. The sepals and petals were bright deep pink with slightly darker veining. The labellum was deep pinkish-purple with deep cream - yellow at the base and some lining and barring.

## **CYMBIDIUMS**

Over the past month, not a day goes past without phone calls about your cymbidiums. I am happy to receive your calls, but thought it a good idea to print some information below.

**POSITION:** These orchids are epiphytes, which means that in the wild they grow in forks of trees where they receive dappled sunlight all day. So in cultivation, the ideal position for optimum growth and flowers is filtered sun all day e.g. a shadehouse with 50% shade cloth. This should be situated in an open position with no trees or buildings that will give shade. If this is not possible, give your cymbidiums the most filtered sunlight per day that you can or place them under a deciduous tree, on the northern side, so that they receive the most sun in winter and yet are protected from the hot overhead sun in summer. This will also protect them from light frosts. If regular or heavy frosts are prevalent in your area, a solid cover, e.g. a clear fibreglass type of material cover will be necessary in winter. This is also a good idea when they are in spike or flower as it protects the blooms.

**FLOWERING:** To produce flower spikes, a temperature drop to approximately 10c for a short period each day is needed in Spring and Summer. Watering in the evenings on hot days will achieve this. In some areas this drop occurs naturally.

**WATERING:** A rough watering guide can be given by temperature:- If the temperature is under 20c, water once a week, depending on rainfall. When the temperature is between 20c and 30c, water 2-3 times a week. If the temperature is over 30c, water every day, and twice a day if it is very hot. However, other factors can affect drying; hot north winds and dew fall for example.

**POTTING MIX:** It is easier if all your orchids are potted in the same kind of mix and pots. So, if you buy or win an orchid, it will pay you to re-pot it, using the same mix as your other cymbidiums. This will help with the watering, as they are more likely to dry out evenly. There is a wide range of potting media that can be used; the main thing is that the mix is free-draining, as the roots don't like to be soggy or waterlogged. The medium should be slightly acid – PH5. Plain pine bark can be used or a mixture of pine bark, sand and marble chips. For small collections of orchids, a commercial cymbidium potting mix can be used and is easier than mixing your own.

**DIVIDING OR RE-POTTING:** When dividing or re-potting your orchids, pot into a size pot that the orchid can stay in for 3 years. This is the time span for re-potting, even if the orchid doesn't need dividing as the potting mix breaks down in this time and will hold too much moisture. Report as soon as flowers are finished or picked, spring is usually the best time and before the end of November if possible. Autumn is also a good time. The main thing is not to re-pot when it is very hot or cold. When dividing the plant, leave at least 3 green bulbs with leaves on the main division, as this is a good flowering sized plant.

**FERTILIZING:** Slow release fertilizers can be used every 3 months. If using other fertilizers in powder form that are mixed with water, always use half strength and there is less likelihood of burning the plant. Use fortnightly except in winter when no fertilizer is needed.
