Correct Writing of Plant Labels.

At the last Monthly meeting, John Gay rightly highlighted a problem noted where Members write the orchid name incorrectly, or incompletely.

John sighted the use of cultivar names used on the label with no listing of it's registered name.

There is also concern about the **over use** of capital letters incorrectly.

Members are asked to carefully write their orchid names. It is even more important at this time because we have 6 new pencillers who have now completed 4 sessions to experience the issues to correctly record your prize winning results for publication.

If you have a species *Zygopetalum mackayi* – when writing the label use; *Z. mackayi*, (note the lower case writing for all species orchids **and only one i**) –like a one eyed football supporter!

Cymbidiums can be abbreviated to Cym

Example of writing a particular cymbidium: Cym. Jubilation 'Geronimo'

Note: an uppercase 'J', the rest is written in lower case – with the cultivar name in comers, ('Geronimo')

If you are unsure of the correct abbreviation then write the genera name in full. i.e. *Diuris, Pterostylis, Potinara, Epidendrum.*

My request of Members is to assist you, the pencillers and our club by paying attention to the correct spelling of orchid names on your plant labels for monthly meetings and shows. If in doubt, as John Gay said at the meeting, ask a judge or some one who can help you. Thank You -

JUNE MONTHLY FLORAL COMPETITION RESULTS

Flower of Open Division and Flower of the Night: Blc. Mount Sylvan 'Dee-Pee' grown by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. This hybrid, first made in Australia, was registered in 1984. It is a standard shape hybrid Laelinae >100mm in diameter. The flower was some 170mm wide and 180mm long, well filled in with overlapping frilled petals and a frilled labellum. The sepals and petals were lavender, the labellum was edged in lavender and had a short narrow purple at the centre front edge and shaded cream to bright yellow towards the back half.

Its sepals and petals were yellow overlaid with very fine reddish brown spots to give a brownish orange overall appearance. The labellum was yellow spotted and striped with deep red.

OTHER PLANTS OF NOTE DISPLAYED ON THE NIGHT

Open Division

This division dominated the show-bench this month having the largest number of plants benched with a variety of species and hybrids in a number of genera.

A large plant of the species *Paph. insigne*, benched by Helmuth Gerber, carried 15 typical shiny well displayed flowers with a pale green dorsal sepal spotted with brown and edged in white, brown tessellated petals and brown pouch.

Peter and Geraldine Flavel benched an interesting non-Australian hybrid Dendrobium, *Den.* Okai 'Oka'. The plant had one spike with 10 fully open flowers and six buds. The flowers had yellow sepals, petals and labellum which shaded to a deep brownish purple on their outer half.



Amongst the Paphiopedilums brought in by open division members was the novelty *Paph*. Clair de Lune grown by Helmut and Ursula Herrman. This hybrid is a "maudiae" type having the species *Paph. lawrenceanum* and *Paph. callosum* in its background. A nicely grown plant carrying one flower with green striped white dorsal and ventral sepals, green down swept petals with white upturned ends and a green pouch. The petals had small warts and hairs on the petal edge typical of maudiae type Paphs.

A number of colourful and attractive smaller flowered Cymbidiums were tabled, including *Cym.* Tricia Allen grown by Helmuth Gerber. This plant carried one spike of green flowers, the sepals and petals having brownish maroon central strips composed of tiny spots and a creamish white labellum heavily barred with deep maroon.

First Division

There were not as many plants benched as in open division but still an interesting display. Amongst these was a seedling plant of the species *Laelia anceps* grown by Malcolm Young. This plant carried a nicely shaped flower with deep lavender-purple sepals and petals a contrasting deep purple labellum with bright yellow at its base.

Valerie and Peter Speer benched a pot of some six plants of the Australian native greenhood *Pterostylis collina* from the Tallai Range of southern Queensland. Two of these plants had open flowers, two others still in bud. The dorsal sepal, fused with the two petals, formed the pale green and white striped galea (hood) and the two green erect ventral sepals, fused at the base, formed the two long vertical tails.

Oncidium (Easy Gold x [Mimmi x Summer Cloud]) grown by Suzanne Willcox carried two spikes, one of 21 flowers and a smaller one. The attractive tiny flowers were lavender pink, the labellum had a yellow base and the column was deep lavender pink.

Second Division

A small number of plants were displayed in this division, one being the Australian native hybrid, *Den.* Anne's Rainbow Surprise grown by John Dunn. The plant carried one spike with 10 open flowers and one bud as well as four more spikes with nearly all flowers still to open. The attractive open flowers had deep reddish purple sepals shading to cream at their bases. The cream labellum was shaded and striped with similar purplish tones.

Haraella retrocalla


Some oddbods were braving the cold, this month. Two closely related south east Asian dendrobes, delacourii and venustum were on the bench. The first, a smaller grower sports small

bunches of white flowers with a slight purple colouring on the lip. D. venustum is a larger grower with mustard flowers. The feature of these species

is their curious fringed lips. The lip is sur-

rounded by fleshy finger like projections- guite odd! Both come from Thailand and Burma and are intermediate growers.

The other pair of plants was *D. schneiderae* represented by both

much the same, major is slightly bigger -looking like a nest of green shallots. The flowers are small and numerous on a raceme and are pale yellow. The var major has more and widely spaced slightly bigger flowers but the var. schneiderae has smaller flowers with better colour, the lip being fringed with a fine red line. This species is a reliable winter flowerer and does well on a slab hung under a

Cattleya trianaei cv.mooreana was the "glamour puss" tonight. Large classic cattleya flowers with a richly coloured lip. Laelia gouldiana was trying to keep up, with heads of intensely purple heads of flowers. An easy growing reliable species. Other species on display; Haraella retrocalla -a small Taiwanese vanda type, Gongora crispa neat pale yellow racemes of flowers and Cymbidium gigantium (syn irioides) -big sprays of open tannish flowers. 
