AUDITOR'S REPORT

22nd January 2011

TO: The Committee and members of the South Coast Orchid Club

REFERENCE: Audit of club books January 2011.

I have examined the books of the club for the year ended 31st December 2010. The audit methodology adopted was as follows:

Two months of cheque transactions were randomly selected for audit. All transactions were proved back to the bank statement, and no anomalies were detected.

About 10 deposit amounts were randomly selected from the bank statement and analysed back to source receipts. Again, no anomalies were detected.

The Financial Statements were examined for reasonableness of structure and legibility, and I am satisfied that they present a reasonable view of club operations.

Based on the records presented to me and on the samples selected for examination, in my opinion the Statement of Income and Expenditure and the associated Statement of Assets present a true and fair view of club operations for the year.

TREASURER'S REPORT as at 31/12/10

You will see from the statements enclosed with this Gazette, that despite another difficult year where our plants have continued to suffer following years of drought, the Club continues to be financially sound.

The Club presently has a short term investment of \$10,000.00 with the ANZ Bank and we have a healthy bank balance as at the 31st December of \$3,867,22. All accounts to the end of the year have been paid.

You will see from the statements that our Autumn, Winter, Spring and Victor Harbor Shows have generated good profit.

The trading table is primarily run to provide specialist products to you the members. Items for sale are sometimes unavailable at local hardware stores. The trading table sales have also realized a good profit.

This income has enabled the committee to continue to subsidize social events and to award members with prizes, ribbons and trophies. This year the committee has also reintroduced small amounts of prize money.

Financial records to the 31st December 2010 have been audited by Mr William van de Water, a registered chartered accountant.

December Plant Commentary:

Open Division and Flower of the Night: *Den.* Impact benched by Geraldine and Peter Flavel. A tall plant of four canes with two leaves each. The plant carried three inflorescences, one with nine open flowers, another with nine open flowers and a few buds still to open and a third with 4 open flowers and more than 10 buds. Flowers were 80mm wide and 75mm from the tip of the dorsal sepal to the tip of the labellum. All segments were deep purplish-pink shading to cream/white at their bases.



Flower of First Division: *Blc.* Goldmine 'Corona' grown by Rito and Rosetta Sylvestry. A large plant with 10 inflorescences with mainly 3 or 4 flowers which were 75mm across and 80 to 85mm tall. Sepals and petals were deep butter yellow shading orange/yellow towards their tips, the petals having deeper shading than the sepals. The 3 lobed labellum was deep red shading to orange at the base.



Flower of Second Division: *Cym.* Little Beauty 'Sundaani' grown by George Misirlis. A large plant with four inflorescences at least 90cm – 100cm long cascading down over the pot, each with at least 50 flowers open. Flowers were 25mm wide by 35mm long and all segments were a deep mahogany red with the sepals and petals having a very fine pale yellowish edge.



A few other plants benched by members:

Bif. harrisoniae benched by Paul and Donja Hayes. A well-grown plant with one inflorescence of two flowers 75mm wide by 65mm tall. Cream/white sepals and petals, light yellow at their base, a deep purple labellum and a white column.

Epi. Topaz Delight grown by Pauline and Mark Hockey. A nice plant with 6 inflorescences mostly with many open flowers and some buds still to open. Sepals and petals were deep purplish-pink as were the three lobes of the labellum that was white at the base.

Blc. Sylvia Fry 'Wallacia' benched by Noel Oliver. A single flower on a medium sized plan, 140mm wide and 145mm tall. Deep purple sepals and petals with the petals shading lighter towards the base. The mid-lobe of the labellum was deep purple, side-lobes folding up over the column and the labellum shaded to yellow and purple at the base.
