This is the third year we have had a 'January Fun Night'. (Lucy and Geoff think it would be a good idea to make this a permanent occasion). Lucy will discuss this at the committee meeting.

After the BBQ, Graham Zerbe showed a power point presentation of the best of Division for 2012. Fifty-two Members stayed back to see the presentation and listen to Graham's very funny jokes.

The popular voting has grown from six orchid plants to nineteen, entered this year. Paul Hayes won the popular vote with a Stanhopea. There were some very nice plants entered, Phragmipedium, Phalaenopsis and Oncidiums.

The President and grandson Daniel closed the Meeting, drawing the Raffle and sharing a few jokes.

TREASUER'S REPORT

In spite of another difficult year, the Club continues to prosper and recorded a surplus of \$1,706.05 for the year.

During 2012 our Term Deposit investment has increased from \$12,001.54 to \$12,732.90.

The Club's equipment has been upgraded with the purchase of a new light projector, keyboards and a printer.

The Committee has worked hard to ensure that members have the benefit of interesting speakers, good social activities and being able to bench orchids at first class shows.

The Auditor's Report is provided for your perusal and in response thereto I advise as follows:

The anomaly referred to therein had no effect on the Club's financial result and was merely incorrectly recording an amount on a cheque requisition. The actual cheque and cheque butt were correctly written out.

The reference by the Auditor to being unable to ascertain the source of several entries on the bank statement was due to the use by trading people during Shows of Express Deposit banking bags. Express deposits were clearly identified on the Club's monthly receipt statements, which statements in turn reconciled with the Bank Statements. The Auditor was supplied with these statements which are in effect a receipt ledger. Often details of express deposits were not provided to me before the close of the month and thus these deposits were recorded as "direct deposits" rather than being issued a receipt number.

I have been Treasurer for eight years and have always produced reports as directed by the previous Treasurer and the Committee. These reports have always been acceptable to the previous Club Auditor and to Members, but are clearly not acceptable to the current Auditor. Although I use bookkeeping software in the course of my employment and for my volunteer work with the Australian Air Force Cadets it has always been the policy of this Club that money need not be spent on accounting software when Microsoft Excel is available at no cost.

In a Club such as ours where a large slice of our income comes from trading table sales, it is difficult to have a budget as the amounts paid to growers depends on the plant sales at our shows. This is always an unknown quantity. Regular expenses are known and clearly shown on the enclosed Statement of Income and Expenditure. For example, we know how much we need to spend on rent, insurance and the like, so in effect we do have a budget.

The Club's operating expenses are high but receipts are available for scrutiny by any Member. A large amount is spent on photocopying and postage to provide Gazettes to Members. This amount could be reduced if Members with internet could provide an e-mail address and then receive the monthly Gazette in living colour.

AUDITORS REPORT

20 January 2013

TO: The Committee and members of the South Coast Orchid Club

REFERENCE: Audit of club books.

I have examined the books of the club for the year ended 31st December 2012. The audit methodology adopted was as follows:

- Two months of cheque transactions were randomly selected for audit. All transactions were
 proved back to the bank statement, and only one minor anomaly was detected. This
 anomaly had no material effect on the Club's financial result.
- The Club's receipt books were examined, and several ranges of dates were selected for audit. I was able to prove some sets of receipts back to the bank statement, but not all. I was unable to ascertain the source of several entries on the bank statement.
- The Financial Statements were examined for reasonableness of structure and legibility, and I am satisfied that they present a reasonable view of club operations.

Based on the records presented to me and on the samples selected for examination and subject to the comments expressed separately, in my opinion the Statement of Income and Expenditure and the associated Statement of Assets present a true and fair view of club operations for the year.

December Plant Commentary

<u>Flower of Open Division abd Flower of the Night:</u> *Den.* Impact benched by Peter and Geraldine Flavel.

A large plant carrying 5 inflorescences, 14 open flowers and 3 in bud, 14 and 7 buds, 12 and 4 buds, 7 and 9 buds and 3 open and 10 still to open. Large, showy flowers 75mm tall by 80mm wide. Sepals and petals were magenta shading to cream near the flower centre. The labellum was deep magenta and cream close to the centre and yellow along the mid-line.





December Plant Commentary (cont.)

Flower of First Division: *Onc.* Spacelatum benched by Wendy lodge. A very large plant carrying 10 infloresences, carrying many flowers, most of which were open. Flowers were 28mm tall by 25mm wide. All flower segments were yellow with brown markings towards the centre of the flower. A very good display of flowers.





Flower of Second Division: Coel. tomentosa benched by Paul and Donya Hayes. A large well grown plant presented on a stand as the inflorescences cascaded down the pot. One inflorescence bore 18 flowers open making a very good display. The flowers were 45mm tall by 60mm wide. Sepals and petals were pale yellow, the labellum yellow with red markings and the column was also yellow.
