Congratulations to all the winners at the May Show. Every member is to be congratulated on all the support given to make our Autumn Show so very successful. Thank you to all Committee Members for a job well done.

Hallett Cove once again was a great build up to our Autumn Show at Colonnades. We have put our names down to have a stand in the new Shopping Centre when it is built at Hallett Cove. It would be great to have a display and trading table in the new area.

S.A.R.O.C. Fair is always a lot of fun to put in a display (please don't let it rain on Friday 9th, between 6pm and 6.30pm - this is our put-in-time. Last year, right at this time we were all soppingwet). The girls have the display well in hand for both the Species Group and Main Display.

June, a display at Centro Cowandilla, to promote our Winter show at Kurralta Park. For this we will need Flowering plants and volunteers to man the Stand.

Committee have been planning the Winter Show. This is a new site for us and we know it will do very well - a very busy shopping area. Let's make this a great Display and selling area.

Remember the plant you leave at home could be Grand Champion. Bring it along and let the Judges decide.

Members, from what I hear the flowering season this year is going to be one of the best years ever. Listed below are a few pointers to help you, stakes straight in the pots, tie up while buds are there as

once flowers are open you could damage lips etc. Remove husks from bulbs and spikes. A few snail pellets shade, white and greens for clarity of colour, leave reds and dark pink in the shade house as the cold enhances the colours and of course this information is for Cyms.

Transporting Cyms to shows, clean leaves with a little milk and water mixed, make sure pot is clean, with no white residue around drain holes, bunch leaves together with twisties or strips of pantyhose, this reduces damage to flowers. Remember to remove before bringing plant into meeting hall. Please remember green - open, buff -first and yellow - second.

With name of plant and Show No on bottom right hand corner. Your label Show No is on your address label of the Gazette.

Please bring along all your plants for judging on the Shows. The one you leave at home could be a Champion.

PAINTING AUCTION



Grand Champion and Champion 1st Division

Zygopetalum mackayi grown by John Robinson. A very well grown plant carrying large flowers for the species. There were six inflorescences with open flowers and another six still in bud. The broad sepals and petals were spotted and striped in deep red-brown while the lightly ruffled white labellum was heavily striped in deep purple.






Champion Open Division

Slc. Sierra Skies 'Leone' grown by Bev and John Gay. A moderate size well grown plant with a single inflorescence carrying a single well shaped and filled in flower. The spaces between the

sepals were filled by the broad petals and the flower was balanced by the broad round labellum. All segments were a vibrant deep purplish-red.

Champion 2nd Division

Onc. pulvinatum grown by Wendy Lodge. The well grown plant carried a single much branched inflorescence of many yellow flowers. All segments were of the same yellow background colour, the sepals and petals being barred in light brown on the half nearest the flower centre. The labellum, forming the skirt of this genus commonly called 'dancing lady orchids' was spotted in the same light brown colour.



A few other plants benched by members on the night:

Open Division:

Enc. cocchleata grown by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. A well grown plant carrying three inflorescences. The flowers of this species have a different orientation to those of the majority of orchids. The greenish yellow narrow pointed petals and sepals hang down from the centre of the flower while the round labellum is held up almost vertically. The side lobes of the labellum were a solid deep reddish brown, striped towards the centre on a pale green base while the centre lobe was striped a lighter brown on a muted olive green base.

Epi. elongatum grown by Geoff and Lucy Spear. A very nice specimen plant with 17 inflorescences carrying heads of small lavender pink typical "crucifix orchid" flowers.

Stenoglottis longifolia grown by Malcolm Guy. A terrestrial genus from South Africa, a good display was produced from a potful of tuber-like fleshy roots. There were 13 inflorescences carrying open flowers (this is a progressive flowering plant) and three inflorescences still in bud. One of the features of these attractive tiny flowers is the way in which the centre lobe of the labellum is divided into 5 fine strips giving them the appearance of being bearded.

1st Division

C. Carol Bernice 'Rob' grown by Jim Shaughnessy. Strongly grown plant with a single inflorescence of 18 well displayed flowers arranged evenly around the stem. Sepals and petals were light

brownish pink with pale green shading along the mid-line, deep maroon spotting towards the outer ends. The white labellum had a striking purple mid-lobe complimenting the rest of the flower. This plant was awarded an AOC quality award, an HCC, on the night.



Cym. dayanum grown by Norm Woodend. The plant carried some fifteen inflorescences with open flowers and two in bud. The petals of

the small flowers of this species protrude forward towards the deep maroon column. The sepals and petals were a pinkish cream with a deep maroon central stripe of very fine spots. The labellum was dark maroon with a cream centre striped towards its base.

Den. Anne's Rainbow Surprise grown by David and Kay Cammack. The large plant carried five inflorescences with open flowers and another five in bud. Sepals and petals were light yellow with a light red blush towards the tips. The yellow labellum had a reddish pink central stripe flanked by fine red spotting on its mid-lobe.

2nd Division:

Epi. Rhody Kim grown by John Dunn. A well grown plant carrying five open flowers and three buds. The sepals and petals were a solid deep pinkish purple, the side lobes of the labellum were the same colour while the centre lobe was darker purple with a very deep blotch towards its creamish base.

Milt. Christine Carpenter Rumsfelt grown by Wendy Lodge. The narrow pointed sepals and slightly broader pointed petals were all a uniform deep purple in colour. The wide and rounded labellum with a slightly undulating edge was a slightly lighter pinkish purple with darker short purple stripes and raised narrow sections at its base. The column was dark purple.

Cym. Choc 'Black Lip' grown by Rod and Judy McRedmnod. A well grown plant in the 60 to 90mm class with sepals and petals which are relatively broad for Cymbidiums flowering at this time of the year. The sepals and petals had very fine deep brown spotting on a cream base and the labellum was solid deep red edged white at its periphery and broke into stripes on a cream base towards the centre.

SPECIES GROUP

20 members attended the May species meeting and were treated to a nice array of species across a wide variety of genera.

Australian species were well represented. *Dockrillia wassellii* mounted on a large piece of natural cork bark was nicely flowered with several racemes of small white flowers complementing the terete leaves. This is a fairly easy orchid to grow if given a minimum temperature of 10c with plenty of air movement, ample water during the warmer months & kept fairly dry during the winter. To induce flowering reduce the temperature when the leaves on the new growths have made up. Requiring similar treatment is another Aussie species *Dock rigida* but does require a little more warmth in our winter, a minimum of 12c at least. A small plant with thick cylindrical leaves giving rise to the specific name of rigida. Flowers are small, crowded on short racemes, colours range from white to cream with a distinctive red labellum.

Also from Northern Australia was a delightful little species *Dendrobium schneiderae* small pseudobulbs the size of a marble topped by one or two leaves the short 8cm racemes arising from between these leaves carrying up to 20 eight mm fragrant flowers. This species also prefers slab culture making sure it is securely tied to the mount. Treatment the same as the previous two but will grow quite happily in temperatures down to 6c if kept on the dry side.

Other species benched were *Den bigibbum* another Australian species. *Masdevallia barleana* from Peru, *Pleurothallis tuerck*-



heimii & Pleuro alleni from Central America, Encyclia elongata from Brazil, Cattleya bowringiana from Guatemala Bulbophyllum rothschildianum from India, Oncidium incurvum from Mexico and Paphiopedilum charlesworthii from India. After commenting on each plant a lively discussion on various potting media and fertiliser rounded off another entertaining and instructive species meeting.
