Keith Northcote welcomed members to the Afternoon Chapter of the Club and outlined the program for the year - Australian Native Orchids.

As a general introduction to the series, Keith went on to explain characteristics of the two major groups - epiphytic and terrestrial. There are no epiphytes native to South Australia as they are generally found growing on trees with persistent bark such as the ironbarks and melaleucas, growing in forests. One of the largest genus in the epiphytes is the *dendrobium* and 60 of this group are endemic to Australia, being found mainly in Queensland and NSW. The Sydney Rock Lily or King Orchid (*speciosum*) and the Pink Rock Lily (*kingianum*) are two of the better known *dendrobiums*.

The genus *sarcochilus* is almost exclusively Australian - 12 out of 13 being endemic.

Terrestrials are well represented in Australia - South Australia being home to many of these.

Some of the best known are the Spider Orchids (*Caladenia*), Donkey Orchids (*Diuris*), Sun Orchids (*Thelymitra*) and Helmet Orchids (*Corybas*). The Greenhood Orchids (*Pterostylis*) have over 70 species native to Australia and surrounding countries - the nodding greenhood is possibly the most common of these. Many of the terrestrial orchids grow in an orchid-fungi relationship and are found in damp, mossy patches of open forest to swampy areas.

There are two *Rhizanthella* Orchids, which are subterranean saprophytic species.

Keith concluded his talk by showing some delightful slides of Native Orchids.

From the variety of orchids on display members chose the white *Phalaenopsis* (Aristocrat x Palm Beach) x Alice Gloria shown by Helen Edwards as their No.1 preference followed by ; C.Summer Stars x *forbesii* (N.Gitsham), Cym. Wyanga Superb x Peter Pan (H.& B. Viney), *Enc. radiata* (H.Edwards), Ctna. Jamaica Red (H.Edwards), all in second place with third being Epi. Sunray King (K.H.Northcote)

A very pleasant and informative afternoon was rounded off with a cuppa and a chat.
