South Coast Winter Show Plant Commentary

Grand Champion:

Dock. teretifolia benched by David and Kay Cammack. A well grown medium sized plant covered with numerous inflorescences bearing five to eight flowers some 50mm across at the broadest point and 40mm high. Flowers were white with a dusting of red spots on the labellum.

Champion Cymbidium 60 – 90mm:

Cym. One Tree Hill 'Golden Ball' exhibited by Silvester Ng. A large showy plant with five inflorescences fully open. The 65mm wide by 60mm high flowers were well filled in, with broad yellowish green sepals and petals and a fine red central stripe. The creamish labellum and had deep red around the edge of its centre lobe.



Champion Cymbidium >90mm:

Cym. (Valley Picture x Rembrandt) benched by Norman Woodend. A well grown plant with nicely displayed flowers 95mm wide and 90mm tall. The broad sepals and petals filled in the round flowers and were light brown on a greenish base. The mid lobe of the yellow labellum was complimented by a narrow band of small red spots.

Champion Laeliinae:

Lc. Adelaide Ablaze 'Sunburst' shown by Peter and Geraldine Flavel. The plant carried three inflorescence bearing clusters of flowers. Sepals and petals were orange with a small amount of yellow at their base. The mid-lobe of the yellow labellum was deep red.

Champion Phalaenopsis:

Phal. Brother Dendi 'Ben' exhibited by Richard and Heather Fishlock. The plant carried a single branched inflorescence with five open flowers and several still to come. pinkish-red on a yellowish base with the base colour around the edges. Sepals and petals were deep The yellow labellum had a prominent red mid-lobe and red on the edges of the side lobes.

Champion Zygopetalum:

Z. Advance Australia shown by Kevin Trevan. A well grown plant with a single inflorescence of five open flowers and a bud. The well displayed flowers had broad sepals and petals of dark purplish brown on a yellow base which showed through between the large brown patched and fine line around the edge. The broad white labellum was heavily striped with purple which thinned out towards the outer edge.




Flower of First Division:

SPECIES GROUP

A group of species enthusiasts met on Monday 18th August. The reason for the smaller group was due to member's sickness and work requirements. This did not deter the group from having a very interesting meeting looking at & discussing the species that were brought in.

There were several Australian species at this meeting as you would expect, late winter, early spring is the time to admire these interesting plants. The first one that took the eye was a mounted plant of *Dockrillia teretefolia* the name referring to the terete shaped leaves. It was only a small plant that carried a single spray of spidery white flowers. This species is commonly called 'The wedding veil orchid' as when it grows into a mature plant up to 3mtrs long with many racemes of white flowers it does indeed look like a bride's veil. A less flattering common name is the 'Rats tail orchid'

It is an easy species to grow. Due to the pendulous nature of the growth habit it must be mounted on a suitable mount rather than in a pot, a short length of Casuarina branch is ideal or any piece of branch that does not shed its bark. Its natural habitat is eastern Queensland to south eastern NSW in swampy areas along side streams. To grow it successfully in SA it requires good light, plenty of air movement & humidity. This can be achieved in a shadehouse with 50% shade & attention to these details.

Another Aussie native species was *Dendrobium aemulum* known as the 'Ironbark Orchid' in reference to its preference for growing on trees of ironbark species of Eucalyptus. It comes from the same areas as *Dock teretefolia* & in cultivation requires similar treatment. The form of the plant is quite different however having short, squat, dark coloured pseudobulbs up to 30cms but often shorter. The flowers are similar to teretefolia but not produced in such abundance, however a well grown specimen covered in white spidery flowers can be a picture.


There were a couple of other Aussie natives benched. *Dendrobium tetragonum* nicely flowered on a mount and a *Sarcochilus olivaceous* with delicate creamy white flowers partially hidden under the falcate leaves. When not in flower this species looks like the more commonly available Sarcochilus falcatus & in fact the owner of this plant purchased it as that species.

A quite different species from Central America was *Restrepia roja* this is a species belonging to the huge genus Pleurothallis that consists of well over 1000 species. We are privileged in the species club to see many of these unique plants each month. They are in the main quite small plants with often colourful flowers. *Restrepia roja* has small petals & sepals but a large brilliant red labellum.

Other species we saw were; Serapias lingua, Bulbophyllum ambrosia, Laelia anceps & Pterostylus nutans white form.

The meeting concluded with a social chat over a cuppa.
