February Plant Commentary:

Best in Open Division and Flower of the Night: *Rlc.* (*Blc.*) Makaha Gold x (*C.*) Chocolate Drop benched by Richard and Beryl Wilson. 'A pot full of plant' bearing four inflorescences, one with five flowers and the other three with three flowers which were 75 – 85mm across and approximately 95 mm tall. Sepals and petals were orange brown in colour with some yellow shading towards the centre. The labellum was bright yellow on the inner surface shading to light brown at the tip of the mid-lobe where there was also a small amount of red blotching which complimented the other colours of the flowers.





Best in First Division: *Epi.* (Orange Blaze x Pacific Glory) benched by Pauline and Mark Hockey). A very nice hybrid with two inflorescences bearing ten and five fully open flowers with additional buds still to open. The sepals and petals were orange-red and the wide petals produced nicely filled in flowers. The labellum, giving this group of plants the common name of 'crucifix orchid' is upright and in the form of a cross. Labellum colour was similar to the colour of the other segments but a little lighter and was more yellow at the base.





Best in Second Division: *Paph.* Liemianum x Dalla benched by Trevor Stutley. A very attractive novelty Paph. on a well grown clean plant. Flowers 85mm across by 75mm tall. The dorsal sepal was striped in brown on a background of lighter greenish brown with a wide pale green margin around the edge. The upper halves of the petals were deep mahogany/maroon, the lower half with a similar coloured linear stripes on a greenish background and there were many fine hairs around both top and bottom edges. The labellum was brown with a fine light green border at the opening. The ventral sepal was green.





CYMBIDIUMS

Growers of Cymbidiums who have succeeded in negotiating the recent hot weather with little or no damage to their plants are to be congratulated, however, with the approach of Autumn, considerable sting has gone out of the sun and now is a good time to attend to your plants and obtain the best results from the forth coming flowing season. Cyms will benefit from a dose of your favourite feeding on a regular basis be it liquid fertilizer of solid.

Flowing spikes will have appeared from the base of mature bulbs or will be breaking through the outer most leaves at the base on new growths. They will continue to appear over the next few months, it is wise to turn the plant and face the developing flower spikes in a northerly direction thus eliminating unsightly bends in the spikes as it develops. If you have any insects, fungal or bacterial problems now is the time to combat these before flower buds emerge from the sheath, if you have succeeded avoiding such problems don't rest on your laurels but apply a cover spray for prevention, it is far easier to prevent a problem rather than waiting till it has a hold. Again use your favourite spray & program. Remember to always water before you fertilize.

If you are troubled with red spider or mite you will find maverik + white oil mixed very effective. Slugs and snails are about and should be eliminated long before flowering season. There are a number of good baits available. Another pest is mice, they eat the pollen caps from the flowers making them useless for cut flowers or showing, a most useful method, is a length of plastic tubing with a cap one end with mouse bait placed inside it, this will then be kept dry and away from your pets.

Air movement is of great importance and is a great help in controlling fungal and bacterial out breaks. A circulating fan of some description will be beneficial in a glass house especially at night due to moist and humid conditions, fungal spors germinate with alarming rapidity. A few minutes spent daily in the glass house or shade house with the trained eye of a grower ascertains any change in growth habit or diseased development. This will pay handsome dividends when the flowering season commences the flower spikes and eventual flowering is the culmination of 12 months growing and each grower should be prepared to spend a little extra daily time, to ensure this flowering is unimpaired.
