October Plant Commentary

Flower of Open Division and Flower of the Night: *Dendrobium striolatum* 'Leedham' was benched by Lucy and Geoff Spear. The plant was mounted on a section of of a house brick; well grown and flowered with many typical striolatum type flowers, very fresh and clean. There were too many flowers to count and I was told that there were more a week earlier. The flowers were approximately 27mm wide by 25 mm high, yellow in colour with a white frilly labellum. An excellent specimen plant and credit to the growers for the culture exhibited.

Well done Lucy and Geoff, you are growing your orchids exceptionally well.

There were 19 plants benched in Open Division on the night.

October Plant Commentary (cont.)

Flower of First Division: *Dendrobium x delicatum* was benched by Rito and Rosetta Silvestri. This plant was only a smallish plant by the usual "Silvestri standard;" well grown and flowered with twelve upright inflorescences carrying as many as 16 flowers on an inflorescence. The flowers were of the smaller delicatum type flowers very fresh and clean.

The flowers were approximately 20mm wide by 23 mm high creamy white in colour highlighted with a faint pinkish tinge and a spotted labellum. An excellent specimen plant and credit to the growers for the culture exhibited.

Well done Rito and Rosetta, keep up the good work.

Flower of Second Division: *Cymbidium* Devon Shell 'No.2' was benched by Michael Willoughby and Oui Ju this plant was very well grown and carried 15 inflorescences averaging around 24 flowers per inflorescences. The flowers were very clean and fresh, a fawny tan in colour with darker pinkish stripes on the petals and sepals., The labellum sat flat and was very attractive with a two toned burgundy coloured; blotched with a different burgundy tone edged front and back in white, with golden yellow keels with burgundy spotting, highlighted with a creamy white pollen cap.

Another well grown *Cymbidium* plant presented by Michael and Oui, you guys are certainly growing and presenting your plants very well. Keep up the good work Michael & Oui.

There were 35 plants benched on the night.
